





But the summer is not just the grand times of mindless bewilderment.


The push and pull of the tides are roughly the same motion and rhythm of my own chaotic emotions and feelings.


That is why, in the early afternoon of May, I felt my heart for what it truly is.


An organ, a piece of meat with no other purpose than to pump sanguine liquid through my corporeal form.

But what I can be certain of, is the forlorn and hopeless heap of sadness lodged where my true heart used to sit.










#### Kikagaku Moyo Kumoyo Island

Kikagaku Moyo is a Japanese psych band that formed in 2012 in Tokyo. They were originally a busking band as Japanese renues tended to charge performers to play rather than paying them and their attempts

to set up their own music festivals were not successful. They found more success outside of Japan gaining a following in Australia and touring in the US. In 2014 they formed their own label, Guruguru Brain, to promote their music and other artists playing similar music. In 2022 the band announced they would be going on an indefinite hiatus making Kumoyo Island their final release. The album is a mix of drifty psych numbers, uptempo jams and the loose free sound of kosmische music. A mix of vocals and instrumentals.

Weird Nightmare is the self-titled first release from Alex Edkins, the guitarist/vocalist from Canadian alt-rock band METZ. Yet unlike in the music he's recorded with METZ, Edkins here goes for a more straightforward, garage pop sound: guitar, base, drums, layered vocal tracks—jangle and distortion. Blending strong hooks with catchy melodies, this album offers some fresh tracks that would have been at home in the post—grunge pop wave of the late—1990s and would fit well into any pop rock set. Check out 1, 3, or 6 for the power singles on the album; tracks 5 and 10 offer a mellower fare.




#### sunset cassie lopez

## Hot Chip @ Brooklyn Bowl Review by Trenton Upchurch

You ever find a band or artist out of sheer luck or coincidence that just blew you away with how incredible they are? Now, I realize that's probably most bands for most people these days; Spotify, Apple Music, random recommendations from friends and the radio are probably where most people find the music they love. WRFL, as it does for

most DJs, has introduced me to an incredible number of bands, ranging from Metronomy and their wavy-synthy pop music, to King Rope and the psychedelia I wish I was around for in the 60s

and 70s, all the way over to the ethereal music of The Beths and Mallrat. But nothing, absolutely nothing, could have prepared me for the absolutely incredible artists that I found on the 29th of August in 2019. A mix of new era electronic, old school indie vocals, precise, clear guitar and MIDI solos, and lyrics to make you question what all the love and hate in the world is really about, in the end. A band that would legitimately change what I thought I knew about music, what a band can do to revolutionize themselves and stay with the times, while keeping their core identity and sacrificing nothing for their art, and becoming a cult classic in one tiny corner of the world. Somehow making their way across the pond at just the perfect time to become one of the greatest bands in the world to me, right up there with the Highwaymen, King Gizzard, and the Rare Americans. That band? Hot Chip.

I found them, waaaaay back in ye olden days of 2019, when the world was young and still somewhat full of joy, tucked away in WRFL's playbox for their newest album at the time, A

Bath Full of Ecstasy. I've always liked British and European indie music: Kasabian, Kaiser Chiefs, Cyan Kicks, The Killers (yes I know, they're popular, but Mr. Brightside is catchy, and I won't let you say otherwise), so on and so forth. Hot Chip, though? They're the first band I went out and bought a vinyl for where

the grave, and all their best releases happened 15 years before my brain developed a proper consciousness. They aren't even

I thought I was lucky to find them, let alone potentially see them if they ever decided to tour again after the mayhem that has been the pandemic (didn't I go on enough about this in the GM letter?).

And in both September and November of 2021, both the unthinkable and a miracle happened: I managed to snag a wonderful girlfriend, Cas, that enjoys their music almost as much as I do, and Hot Chip announced the tour that never finished in

2020 was returning to the United States, to hit all the stops that were skipped. First up? Brooklyn Bowl, in Nashville, Tennessee.

And what a venue it is: A bowling alley, full bar, diner, and stage in one space (I smoked Cas at bowling before the show, but that's beside the point). Full stage, raised platforms for different band members, each of Alexis, Joe, Al, Owen, and Felix getting their own time in the spotlight when their featured portions on the tracks came about. Of course, Alexis and Joe steal the show as the two co-creators and lead vocalists, shredding electronica on a keyboard and guitar as only they can, but the whole of Hot Chip were engaged with the crowd in a way that I've rarely seen before. I've been to a few

local shows in Lexington, but for Music City, Brooklyn Bowl seemed to be an incredibly intimate venue. 300 fans, all packed in a square footage the size of all of Al's Bar indoors and out, and having a blast all the while. Visually, the lighting was

incredible: waving, pulsing lights that drove with the bass and beat of each song to the point of absurdity (I actually thought my chest was going to explode with the bass for 'Hungry Child', it was incredible), and a colorway that never was the same two songs in a row, with every color of the rainbow, and then some.

Musically? Well, I've waxed on quite a bit about how much I love Hot Chip, for years now. Everyone knows how much I enjoy their music. And yet, I'm beyond furious at them, because:



Dropping a golden slice of as close to a musical religious experience as you can get, and then leaving me with no way to find the

remixes, no way to relive one of the most incredible nights of music, dancing, and fun I've ever had? In that way, it's incredibly unique. Never again will Cas or I hear the exact replicas of the songs we heard that night; they're only in my heart now, and that's what

makes that night so special. A one time experience, unable to be duplicated, and all the more precious for it.

Brand new versions of my favorite songs that haunt my dreams, as enjoyable uncoordinated dancing as you can get, a new shirt that I wear all the time, and a once-in-a-lifetime chance to hear my favorite band with my favorite person, off a one-off listen in the playbox in 2019. That's what I got for six minutes of my life back then. I think it was worth it, in the end. Wouldn't you?


